




#### Using the Chat and Q&A Features in WebEx

**Caution:** DBE regulation (49 CFR Part §26.88) grants certifying agencies, such as Caltrans, authority to suspen of the DBE owner, DBE failing to notify in writing of any material change or if a DBE fails to timely complete an Certifying agencies will be implementing this policy beginning September 1, 2015.

**Note:** Contractors are cautioned to verify the real-time DBE database prior to hiring DBE firms. A suspended fi be considered for contract goal on new contracts. The decision to immediately suspend a DBE is not appealable.

The Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Database contains information on certified DBE firms and is upon DBE goals on contracting requirements.

This Work Code Description Chart is a guide only and not a conclusive or comprehensive list of work performed by DBE firms. Certifying agencies use these descriptions, and the accompanying license and NAICS Code cross references, to assign codes that describe a firm's primary business activity. These codes distinguish DBE firms involved in the physically act of construction from those that provide support services and supplies to the construction industry. The tabulated spreadsheets have these various categories separated into specific workgroups. Please note that the issue of whether a firm performs Commercially Useful Function (CUF) is not reviewed at the time of certification (refer 49 CFR 26.73(a)(1));

#### Authority to Assign NAICS and Work Codes


- DBE certifying agencies get their authority from 49 CFR 26.71(n) to assign NAICS Codes and Work Codes
- Certifying agencies can, in addition to applying the appropriate NAICS code, apply a descriptor from a classification scheme of equivalent detail and specificity




#### NAICS Codes

- North American Industry Classification System (NAICS)
- These codes help to identify what your firm's primary business function is
- Will determine what you can bid on within the DBE program
- Standard used by federal agencies in classifying business establishments for the United States business economy
- DBE regulations require NAICS codes to be assigned during the certification process to describe a firm's primary business activity
- Requests for updates should be sent to the DBE Certification Office





# UNITED NATIONS STANDARD PRODUCTS AND SERVICES CODES (UNSPSC) & KEYWORDS OVERVIEW









#### **UNSPSC Codes**

- An 8 digit code used to identify a good or service
  - Example: 14111500, Printing and Writing Paper
- Part of a four level hierarchy
  - Most buyers search for goods within the Level 3 and 4 codes
- These codes are specific to SB and DVBE
- Can be added to and/or updated after certification



#### Keywords

- Keywords describe a good or service that your business can provide
  - Example: concrete, environmental, legal
- Buyers use keywords to find businesses through keyword searches on our databases
- Keyword Tips:
  - Include synonyms and related words everyone searches differently
    - Example: use "copy" and "copier" or "lights", "lighting", and "bulb"
  - List keywords individually, not as a list or sentence
  - List general categories of products and services, as well as any specialty brands you sell
- •Do market research, view competitors profiles to see what keywords they are using
  - Go to Cal eProcure, then search SB/DVBE





# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)

















My firm name/address/email/etc. has changed. How can I make changes to my DBE database listing?

Please notify, in writing, the agency that certified your firm. The agency is listed on your certification document. You can also locate your certifying agency by reviewing your online profile on the DBE Database at <a href="https://ucp.dot.ca.gov/licenseForm.htm">https://ucp.dot.ca.gov/licenseForm.htm</a>.

I'm a certified DBE business, how do I update my work codes now that I'm certified?

Contact your local DSBL to request the Work/NAICS Code Change Request Form. Once completed, this form should be submitted to the Office of Civil Rights at the address listed on the form.

I'm a prime contractor, how can I find DBE firms?

All DBE certified firms are listed in the DBE Directory. You can access the database to find firms in your area at <a href="https://ucp.dot.ca.gov/licenseForm.htm">https://ucp.dot.ca.gov/licenseForm.htm</a>.





I'm a certified Small Business, how do I get connected with purchasers and contractors?

Ensure that you keep your Cal eProcure or DBE profile up to date with your contact information and the keywords and work codes your business provides, as this is the main way we search for companies to do business with.

Don't be afraid to reach out to the Prime Contractors to introduce your business and see what services they commonly use.

Also, attend the events such as Meet the Primes, Procurement Fairs and Contractor's Boot Camps hosted by your DSBL's. These events provide great networking opportunities!

Can I get notified when a contract related to the services my company offers is posted?

Yes! Visit Cal eProcure at <a href="https://caleprocure.ca.gov/pages/index.aspx">https://caleprocure.ca.gov/pages/index.aspx</a> and log in. Then click your user name and select "Manage Notifications". You can select to receive notifications of procurements that are listed under a certain UNSPSC.
