


Road Repairs

500 Bridges







Revenue

Taxes	Fees	Savings
Gasoline excise tax: +12¢/gallon	Transportation improvement fee: \$25 to \$175 based on vehicle value.	Caltrans saves \$100 million/year through efficiency measures
Diesel excise tax: +20¢/gallon	(January 2018) Zero-emissions fee:	
Diesel sales tax: +4%	\$100/yr. (2020)
