NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY STATEMENT

DECLARACIÓN DE POLÍTICA DE NO DISCRIMINACIÓN

FEDERAL RECONNECTING COMMUNITIES PILOT PROGRAM

Background

- Authorized in 2021 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)
- New, first-of-its-kind federally-funded program to reconnect communities divided by transportation infrastructure

Funding Availability

 \$1B of discretionary program; FY 2023 (Cycle 2) NOFO Anticipated June 2023

Purpose

• To reconnect communities divided by transportation infrastructure through planning, design, demolition, and reconstruction of street grids, parks, or other infrastructure to address legacy impacts.

Shoreline Drive Gateway	City of Long Beach, CA	\$30 M	\$69.174 M	Reconfigure West Shoreline Drive , remove a roadway barrier, and improve access and connectivity, create a new bicycle path and pedestrian amenities, and divert highway traffic from residential streets to major roads.
Vision 980 Study Phase 2 - Feasibility Study	Caltrans Oakland, California	\$680K	\$850K	Funds will be used to explore alternatives for reconnecting communities along the I-980 corridor with an expanded focus on community integration and environmental justice.
SR-710 Northern Stub Re- envisioning Project	City of Pasadena, California	\$2M	\$4.405M	Support the study of transportation and land use needs related to the future redevelopment of Pasadena's recently relinquished highway 710 "stub."
Parkway Drive at State Route 99 Pedestrian Bridge	City of Fresno, California	\$600K	\$750K	Support planning activities for a pedestrian bridge that crosses California State Route 99
Monterey Road Highway to Grand Boulevard Design Study	City of San Jose, California	\$2M	\$2.5M	Assess the feasibility and conceptual designs for converting Monterey Road from a motor highway to a grand boulevard



Program Overview

OVERVIEW OF THE SEPARATE STATE AND FEDERAL PROGRAMS

State Funded: RC:H2B

- Administered by Caltrans Local Assistance
- One-time competitive award to a "community" based on need.
- 100% State Funded funding source
- Legislative goal to "provide matching funds for potential federal grant funds"
- Awardees may also work with Caltrans to submit a proposal for RCP Cycle 3.

Federal Funded: RCP

- Administered by USDOT
- Multi-cycle pilot program
- Competitive awards for Planning and Capital Construction Projects.
- Cycle 1, Caltrans issued a call for nominations, submitted 3 applications as a lead, partnered on 21, and provided 22 letters of support.
- Cycle 2 ,Caltrans opened Call for LOS/Partnerships on May 24.


