



# Ventura Freeway (US 101) Improvement Projects

Los Angeles County to Ventura County

## Overview

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) is working to provide a smoother drive and extend the life of the Ventura Freeway (US 101) between the city of Calabasas in Los Angeles County and Padre Juan Canyon Road in Ventura County – a 45-mile span.

Three projects, which total \$104 million, will include pavement rehabilitation on the freeway and shoulders as well as improvements to ramps, the median, and guardrails throughout certain project areas. All construction work is expected to finish by mid 2012.

## What to Expect During Construction

- ▶ Intermittent lane closures
- ▶ Intermittent ramp closures with designated detours
- ▶ Timely construction alerts provided to the public
- ▶ No two consecutive ramps will be closed at the same time



## Improvement Projects

**US 101 between Santa Rosa Road in Camarillo and Padre Juan Canyon Road in Ventura – 24.2 miles**

**Start Date:** Mid May 2011

**End Date:** Early 2012

**Cost:** \$56 Million (state funds)

**US 101 between Westlake Boulevard in Thousand Oaks and Pleasant Valley Road in Camarillo – 12.6 miles**

**Start Date:** March 18, 2011

**End Date:** Summer 2011

**Cost:** \$31 Million (state and American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funds)

**US 101 between Las Virgenes Road in Calabasas and the Ventura County Line – 8.2 miles**

**Start Date:** Early May 2011

**End Date:** Mid 2012

**Cost:** \$17 Million (state funds)
