




State Route 91- Westbound Fullerton to Anaheim

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Project Description

The Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will begin a Safety Project on State Route 91 in the cities of Anaheim and Fullerton. The Construction costs are \$2.5 million. The project limits are from West of Harbor Boulevard Overcrossing to West of East Street Undercrossing. Construction will begin the week of March 18, 2013.

This project will overlay all roadway lanes of the Westbound SR-91 from Harbor Boulevard to East Street, construct new drains, improve existing drainage inlets along the median barrier, upgrade all lane striping and markers and replace road signage. The project has 120 working days. The contractor is Chumo Construction.

Planned Closures

Complete ramp closures are planned at Harbor Boulevard and Lemon Street offramp and Raymond Avenue onramp and offramps. Caltrans will provide advanced notice for planned ramp closures and other mainline impacts.

Project Benefits

Once the Westbound SR-91 at Harbor Boulevard Overcrossing to East Street has been resurfaced, motorists will experience a smoother ride with enhanced freeway lane markings.
